

THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, CITY OF CANTERBURY) (PROHIBITION OF STOPPING ON FOOTWAY OR VERGE) (AMENDMENT NO 1) ORDER 2022

Notice is hereby given that KENT COUNTY COUNCIL propose to make the above Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act.

The effect of the Order is to amend the Kent County Council (Various Roads, City Of Canterbury) (Prohibition Of Stopping On Footway Or Verge) (Consolidation) Order 2021 by introducing new or varying existing parking and waiting restrictions in the Canterbury district:

Broad Oak Road	Canterbury	Extend double yellow lines between St Stephen's Road and Farleigh Road to reduce congestion
Knight Avenue	Canterbury	Yellow lines and pavement and verge parking ban on the green at the top of Knight Avenue to control parking on the grass
St Peter's Place	Canterbury	Pavement Parking Ban on the wide pavement at the junction with St Peter's Street to prevent obstruction and hazards for pedestrians
Pochard Crescent	Herne Bay	Pavement and verge parking ban to avoid obstruction of pavements and damage to verges
Fordwich Road area	Fordwich	Footway and verge parking bans in Fordwich Road, Marlow Meadows and Brooklands Close to reduce congestion and prevent obstruction of the pavements
Island Road	Sturry	Pavement parking ban between Sleigh Road and Homewood Road to avoid obstruction of the pavement
Kimberley Grove	Seasalter	Pavement Parking Ban to avoid obstruction of pavements
